Training Programs

Sustainability Programs

Local and decentralization development programs





Specialized Centers and Units



The Center for Data Analysis and Consultancy (CDAC) is a specialized center established in December 2022 to provide specialized economic, financial, administrative, and statistical consultancy services in the region. CDAC offers its outstanding services to the State and various public and private business sectors in Egypt and elsewhere, depending on reliable statistical and informational indicators. CDAC aims to serve the Egyptian, Arab, and African economies to support sound planning efforts aiming at achieving sustainable development goals (SDGs).



The North African Applied Systems Analysis Center (NAASAC) project is a result of collaboration between the Institute of National Planning, the Academy of Scientific Research and Technology and Maritime Transport, and the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) in Austria. NAASAC was launched on the 20th of December 2021, with a view to building North Africa capacities in areas of systems thinking and systems analysis applications, creating and disseminating a culture of evidence-based decision-making within the region.









The Modelling Unit

A specialized unit established in 2020 to promote capacity building and skills development in the field of quantitative models, with a view to applying these quantitative models in the research outputs prepared by the members of the Unit. This is in addition to ensuring collaboration with Arab and international institutes for conducting joint training and research.



The Economic Governance Unit

The Economic Governance Unit was established at the Institute of National Planning in November 2023. The unit's objective is to prepare national cadres capable of building and applying simulation models using the System Dynamics methodology to study dynamic complex economic, social, and environmental problems within the framework of alternative future scenarios. This aims at supporting policymakers and planning officials at all levels of governance.

The unit is currently developing an integrated simulation model for the sustainable development goals of Egypt, employing a systems dynamics approach. This initiative is part of a partnership with the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the Millennium Institute.





The Quality Assurance and Accreditation Unit aims to implement academic and training programs at outstanding quality rates. The Unit works with national and international institutions to prepare INP for various quality standard certifications.


